The children worked together to produce some powerful shared writing - a story based on Greek mythology along with a science-fiction piece. Words of the Fortnight!

To encourage our children to use a wider range of vocabulary, we set a challenge for the children which we hope you will join in with at home too. Every two weeks, a new word is introduced in each class and the children get rewards for using them in their writing or in conversation. Our new words are:

"Your Time to Shine" Day
