

## A DAY AT SCHOOL


- A named coat

- A healthy snack for break for example an apple, cereal bar, plain biscuit




#### **ENGLISH**

#### **Expectations:**


- To practise their times tables every week Times Table Rockstars.

- End of year 4 times table assessment












#### Intent:


