Key Learning

History: How did Hitler's rise to power affect children's lives?

English: A study of 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman. Diary entries, empathising with characters and writing a series of letters; writing an 'escape' story.

Maths: Division-problem solving; Fractions-using the four operations; Statistics- interpreting data.

Science: How does light travel?
